5. Outstanding / Dominate
An excellent elite-level performance. Player executes effectively all aspects being evaluated and clearly outperforms counterparts. the session. Player can definitely play and have an impact. This player had a lasting dominant effect throughout
4. Above Average
An above average performance. Good plays and decisions clearly outnumber the poor ones. 3. Average

An average performance; requires more observation. Player made their share of mistakes / poor decisions, but they were countered by an equal number of good plays / decisions.
